Foreword

BOARD OF DIRECTORS, BETTER ME E.V.

Dear readers,

2024 was a year of significant milestones that strengthened Better Me as an organization and deepened our commitment to children and youth in Kenya.

One of our greatest achievements was Project ARK (Action for Resilience at Korando), which raised over €30,000 to fund much-needed infrastructure improvements at Korando Educational Center—including a new kitchen, renovated dining hall, upgraded dormitories, showers, classrooms, fire safety measures, and new school materials. Thanks to these developments, the school was officially recognized as a boarding school—a huge step forward for the children and the entire team.

Beyond this milestone, we welcomed 17 returning volunteers—more than ever before—and a total of 43 volunteers from 13 different countries. With their support, we reached over 20,000 beneficiaries and advanced various initiatives, including swimming and art classes at Korando, which promote both physical fitness and creative expression. A particular highlight was dance lessons, where the children developed remarkable confidence and skills, leading to major successes in local competitions. Now, 17 talented students are preparing for an unforgettable journey to Austria in May and June 2025, where they will train with a renowned dance academy.

Our commitment to sports also paid off: the Nyalenda Youngsters Football Club continued to grow and received official confirmation that the FIFA Foundation will support the club in 2025 and 2026—an incredible opportunity for these young talents.

Another milestone: For the first time in our history, we surpassed €100,000 in total revenue (donations & volunteer program). This financial stability allows us to expand our impact and grow sustainably.

None of these achievements would have been possible without our dedicated volunteers, partners, and supporters. Your trust and contributions make a real difference in the lives of children and youth in Kenya.

With great anticipation, we look forward to the year ahead and to achieving even more—together!

We strive for a generation of self-responsible, compassionate and curious young people who work together to strengthen life in all forms. For us, holistic education is the way to achieve this notion.



Where we work

KISUMU COUNTY IN KENYA

Kisumu lies in western Kenya, on the shores of Lake Victoria. Almost half of all households are poor by national standards and around 60% live in informal settlements. Only about half of all residents of Kisumu have a primary school certificate, approximately 60% live in houses with clay floors, and over 70% of the houses are built with walls made of clay, wood and corrugated iron. About 70% of all residents cook with firewood and only about 18% have electric light in their houses.

100% of our beneficiaries live below the poverty line. The average household has 5 people and usually the entire household lives together in a one-room apartment. The majority of households earn their living through precarious casual work or as small entrepreneurs. In rural areas, the majority of our beneficiaries rely on subsistence farming to feed the household.

HOW WE WORK

In order to achieve our goals, we pursue holistic approaches that take into account the complexity of our needs take the world into account. Our solutions are based on the needs of the people we want to achieve and are developed in collaboration with you. To this end, Better Me e.V. supports our partner organization Better Me Kenya, in Kisumu, which leads the work with volunteers, local partner organizations and the government in Nyanza, Kenya. Our presence as Better Me allows us to be in constant discourse with our beneficiaries and stakeholders. The Kisumu office is led by our program coordinator Thomas Ogalo. Our team has continuously worked to improve internal structures and processes to ensure that our help reaches where it is really needed.

Returning Volunteers (Alumni)

In 2024, Better Me experienced a remarkable milestone with the highest number of returning volunteers in our history. Seventeen dedicated individuals returned to continue making a difference, reflecting the lasting bonds and meaningful experiences they've had with us. Overall, we hosted 43 volunteers from 13 countries across five continents, bringing diverse perspectives, skills, and enthusiasm to our projects.



Our volunteers engaged in impactful activities across various partner organizations and community projects. These included the Kisumu Children Remand Home, Kisumu County Referral Hospital, Mama Ngina Children's Home, Nyalenda Youngsters, Kisumu Fire Station, Homeless of Kisumu, and Jijenge Youth Organization. Additionally, we actively participated in the celebration of key international days, highlighting critical social and cultural issue.

This collective effort by our volunteers and partners has amplified our impact, allowing us to reach more people, create lasting change, and inspire hope within the communities we serve. The dedication and contributions of our volunteers continue to drive our mission of building stronger, more resilient communities.





















Youth Unleashed Mentorship Program (YUMP)


ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

The Youth Unleashed Mentorship Program (YUMP) has been a cornerstone of Better Me for four years, empowering youth through mentorship, mental health support, and creative programs. In 2024, YUMP expanded its reach by 25% compared to the previous year, impacting 20,251 individuals across five primary schools, 14 secondary schools, 10 higher learning institutions, and 15 community spaces.

When devastating floods hit Kisumu, YUMP adapted to provide emotional support in displacement camps, offering counseling and activities to help children regain stability.

Beyond mentorship, YUMP became a platform for volunteers to share skills in sports, arts, public speaking, and German language lessons, fostering growth and self-expression.


Through YUMP, Better Me continues to provide safe spaces for young people to grow, heal, and find inspiration. By integrating mentorship, mental health support, and community engagement, the program remains a powerful tool for shaping a generation that is confident, resilient, and empowered to create positive change.





YUMP aims to unleash the potential of Kenyan youth by providing them with the life skills and confidence they need to become thriving members of society.

SHAPE Education Fund

The SHAPE Education Fund is a key initiative in our partnership with Korando Educational Center, supporting students in their transition to secondary school by removing both financial and emotional barriers to education and well-being.

A Holistic Approach

SHAPE (Scholarships for Household Advancement and Psychosocial Empowerment) not only ensures access to quality education but also strengthens students' families by providing tools and support to foster resilience, stability, and growth. This creates an environment that empowers not just individual children but entire communities.

Scholarships in 2024

In 2024, SHAPE awarded scholarships to 139 students, totaling €20,566 (2,851,153 Ksh). This funding provides children with education opportunities while also breaking the cycle of poverty and driving sustainable community change.

Through SHAPE, we are not just investing in education—we are unlocking the potential of young people and supporting the longterm development of their families and communities.







































Case Study: Joseph Skuma*

SHAPE HOUSEHOLD EMPOWERMENT

After graduating high school with the support of our SHAPE Scholarship, Joseph faced an uncertain future. He hadn't qualified for direct university admission, and his widowed mother couldn't afford tuition. Unfortunately, this is a very common situation for many youth in Kenya.

As the eldest of four, he felt responsible for supporting his family and ensuring his siblings could stay in school.

Determined to make a difference and with the support of our Youth Programs Coordinator, he turned to small-scale organic farming to reduce household expenses.

By consistently growing vegetables, he significantly cut food costs. His efforts not only benefited his family but also inspired the community. In just 13 months, he contributed to two women's empowerment training sessions and caught the attention of the Mastercard Foundation, which is now funding an irrigation project on his farm.

Expanding into poultry farming, he grew his flock from 10 to 70 chickens. The income allowed him to renovate part of their mud house and help pay for his younger sisters' high school education. His success has made him a role model, motivating other young people to start their own farming projects. He also provides occasional work for local youth, demonstrating how resilience and innovation can transform lives and uplift communities.

Korando EDUCATIONAL CENTRE

Korando Educational Centre

ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

The Korando Educational Center, founded by Mama Dolfine, has always been one of our most valued partners and a key reason for the founding of Better Me. This year, we deepened our collaboration to create new opportunities for the 330 children of Korando. Our focus was on enhancing the quality of education and supporting teachers, ensuring they are well-equipped to meet the growing demands of the education system.



Teacher Workshops

To improve the quality of education at Korando Educational Center, we organized targeted training sessions. The introduction of the Competency-Based Curriculum (CBC) posed challenges for teachers, so we provided refresher training with practical teaching methods and interactive approaches.

Additionally, we promoted well-being and team spirit through a team-building event and enabled one teacher and one student to attend a workshop in Mombasa.

These initiatives empower both teachers and students, helping them unlock their full potential.

Korando SWIM LESSONS

In 2024, Better Me introduced swimming lessons for all students at Korando Educational Center—an exciting and impactful new initiative. The program not only promoted physical fitness but also emphasized swimming as a life-saving skill, especially in a community where water safety is crucial.

This project was made possible through the generosity and dedication of Jule, one of our volunteers from Germany. She personally funded the first month of swimming lessons for the entire school, giving the children their first structured experience with this essential skill. Inspired by the positive impact, Jule launched a fundraising campaign to extend the lessons. Thanks to her efforts, the school was able to offer an entire year of swimming instruction.

These lessons provided students with a sense of achievement, boosted their self-confidence, and equipped them with a skill that could one day save their lives. This initiative is a shining example of the positive impact volunteers can have on children's lives.

In 2024, Better Me supported various extracurricular activities to nurture the talents and well-being of students at Korando Educational Center. These activities gave students the chance to explore their abilities beyond the classroom while fostering creativity, teamwork, and discipline.

A major highlight was the introduction of a dance program. During playtime, a classroom transformed into a dance studio where children learned ballet, contemporary, modern, and jazz dance. This initiative not only ignited their passion for dance but also led to the discovery of 16 talented students, who will travel to Austria in May and June 2025 to train with an Austrian dance school. For the first time in the school's history, the dance class participated in the Kenya Schools Drama and Films Festival, reaching the regional level—a remarkable achievement for both students and teachers.

Beyond dance, Better Me also supported student participation in inter-school competitions in football, volleyball, netball, and athletics. These sports activities enhanced physical fitness, teamwork, and fair play, contributing to a well-rounded education.

By investing in these programs, Better Me played a key role in the holistic development of the students, helping them discover and nurture their unique talents.

Chapati Festivals

The Chapati Festival, co-hosted by Jijenge Youth Organization and Better Me, promotes Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) by uniting organizations and volunteers to support underserved communities, especially children in care institutions.

The Chapati Festival

Rooted in inclusion, love, and dignity, the festival goes beyond shared meals—providing essentials, strengthening community bonds, and raising awareness of challenges faced by vulnerable youth. Since its inception, over 1,000 volunteers have participated, with a vision to reach 1,000+ people quarterly.

Chapati, a symbol of connection and joy in Kenya, makes this event a meaningful way to commemorate international days focused on children and social inclusion.

Kisumu Children's Remand Home

ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

The Kisumu Children's Remand Home is a government facility that cares for children in conflict with the law, serving as a temporary shelter for those awaiting permanent placement or rehabilitation. Better Me actively supports the home, providing education, psychosocial care, and emotional stability to the children.

Our team visits the home three times a week, offering English lessons, life skills training, counseling, and social support. By leveraging the talents and passions of our volunteers, we create a nurturing and compassionate environment for the children.

In 2024, we successfully reintegration 10 children into their families—a major achievement made possible through close collaboration between our volunteers and the remand home staff. Additionally, the trusting atmosphereencouraged children to share important information, helping facilitate their rehabilitation.

Beyond education and social support, we emphasize the importance of play and recreation. Sports activities and experience days ensure that these children can still enjoy the simple joys of childhood. Our work at the Remand Homedemonstrates how Better Me fosters hope, resilience, and positive change, even in the most challenging circumstances.













ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

Founded by our former volunteers Jakob and Cedrik, Nyalenda Youngsters continues to grow as a transformative football project, supporting over 100 children in the slums of Kisumu. Beyond nurturing young talent, the program instills discipline, teamwork, and essential life skills.

2024 was a year of growth and success:

- Under Coach Billy, 120 training sessions were held, enhancing both football skills and discipline.
- The team participated in eight tournaments, gaining valuable competition experience.
- The well-being of the children remained a priority—our social workers conducted 30 counseling and wellness sessions to provide emotional and social support.
- With 120 boys and 30 girls, Nyalenda Youngsters is among the few inclusive sports initiatives in the region.

A major milestone: The FIFA Foundation has confirmed its support for 2025 and 2026, opening doors for further expansion. Thanks to the dedicated work of the founders, coaches, and social workers, Nyalenda Youngsters remains a beacon of hope, offering young people a platform to pursue both their academic and athletic dreams.







Jijenge Youth Organisation

ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

Jijenge Youth Organization empowers young people with employability skills and work experience to bridge the gap between education and the job market. Many employers hesitate to hire young professionals due to a lack of experience—Jijenge addresses this by equipping them with essential workplace skills.

Wellness for Young Professionals

In 2024, Better Me partnered with Jijenge to deliver 36 weekly wellness sessions for young professionals, covering work-related stress, confidence-building, suicide prevention, and sexual harassment awareness. These sessions fostered mental resilience, emotional intelligence, and teamwork through interactive exercises.

Empowering Woman

ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

In 2024, Better Me continued its collaboration with Armstrong Women Empowerment Center and Dewo Ngima, two impactful, women-led initiatives dedicated to supporting rural women and women living in informal settlements. These organizations provide creative and sustainable solutions to address the societal challenges faced by women, empowering them to build better futures for themselves and their families.

Both projects focus on economic empowerment, skills training, and community support, equipping women with the resources and knowledge necessary to achieve financial independence and social stability. Through this partnership, Better Me has worked alongside these organizations to expand opportunities for women, helping them navigate employment barriers, access mentorship, and develop entrepreneurial skills.

By supporting women-led and women-focused initiatives, Better Me reaffirms its commitment to gender equality, economic empowerment, and community resilience. These partnerships have allowed us to amplify the voices of women, encourage self-sufficiency, and promote inclusive development within Kisumu and beyond. Moving forward, we aim to strengthen our support for these initiatives, ensuring that more women have access to the tools and opportunities they need to thrive.

Other Partnerships

ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

Kisumu County Referral Hospital

In 2024, Kisumu County Referral Hospital deepened its collaboration with Better Me by hosting medical volunteers, providing them with hands-on clinical experience. Two volunteers actively contributed to healthcare services, fostering a valuable exchange of knowledge. Additionally, a former volunteer generously donated 560,000 Ksh worth of essential equipment for the psychiatric department, significantly improving patient comfort. Looking ahead, we aim to place more interns to further support health professionals and community well-being.

Mama Ngina Children's Home

Better Me formalized its partnership with Mama Ngina Children's Home through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), facilitated by Canadian intern Jake Burton. This home cares for orphaned and vulnerable children, many with disabilities. Our volunteers assist caregivers in childcare, creating a playful and loving atmosphere. This collaboration helps build an environment where every child feels valued and supported.

Kisumu Firestation

Better Me partnered with the Kisumu Fire Department to introduce wellness programs for firefighters, including debriefing sessions, yoga, and group therapy to support their mental well-being. Additionally, the fire department conducted a fire safety inspection at the Korando Educational Center, recommended safety improvements, and committed to regular fire drills. This partnership enhances resilience, safety, and overall community well-being.





















Advocacy for the Rights of Children and Youth

ACTIVITIES IN KENYA

In 2024, Better Me continued its advocacy work, leveraging key platforms to showcase our initiatives, strengthen government partnerships, and participate in critical discussions on education, mental health, and social well-being in Africa.

We actively engaged in the Day of the African Child, advocating for inclusive education, and took part in World Mental Health Day, where we highlighted the connection between mental health and workplace well-being. On Africa Day, we contributed to discussions on resilient education systems and the role of women in agriculture. Additionally, we participated in the International Day of Families and International Women's Day, promoting gender equality and strong family structures.

Through these initiatives, Better Me expanded its reach, built valuable collaborations, and continued advocating for policies and programs that create a better future for children, youth, and families across Africa.

In 2024, our child sponsorship program grew, fostering meaningful connections between volunteers, their families, other supporters, and the children of the Korando Educational Center. This program goes beyond financial aid —it allows sponsors to build close relationships with their sponsored children, serving as mentors and role models.

Through monthly contributions, sponsors ensure the education, health, and well-being of the children.
